ORDER

- The present application has been filed by M/s. Mittal Processor Pvt. Ltd., Panipat,
 Haryana for grant of an Intra-State Trading License for trading of power up to
 50MU per year in the State. The case is taken up today for hearing after due notice
 to the parties concerned.
- 2. During hearing nobody is present on behalf of the applicant M/s. Mittal Processor Pvt. Ltd. on repeated calls. The learned Sr. Counsel appearing on behalf of the GRIDCO Ltd. submitted that as per order dated 30.04.2012 of the Commission, the petitioner has filed its amended petition containing updated information's as required in OERC (Conduct of Business) Regulations, 2004 without serving a copy on the respondents. Therefore, they are unable to comment on the amended submission. He further requested the Commission to drop the present proceeding since the information contained in the amended petition refers to FY 2011-12. This was also supported by the Deptt. of Energy, Govt. of Odisha.

- 3. Shri R. P. Mohapatra the objector in the above proceeding has submitted that the applicant M/s. Mittal Processor Pvt. Ltd. has got an Inter-State Trading License from CERC in the year 2009 which recorded an average trading volume of more than 1200 MU/year which is in accordance with CERC norms plus Intra-State Trading of power up to 50 MU/year in Odisha. Therefore there is no necessity for grant of Intra-State Trading License to the applicant and the application filed by M/s. Mittal Processor Pvt. Ltd. for grant of Intra-State Trading License is meaningless and the same may be rejected.
- 4. The objections of the respondents are taken into record. Since nobody is present during hearing from the Petitioner's side on repeated calls, therefore, the case is dismissed for default in pursing the matter by the applicant.
- 5. Accordingly, the matter is disposed of.
